












AUCA Board Member Andru Bramblett shares a special moment with his daughter, Dru.

Alabama Legislative News:

Alabama State Senator Steve Livingston has been elected as the new Senate majority leader. He will succeed Senator Clay Scofield, who recently resigned his position from the Legislature to become executive vice president of the Business Council of Alabama. Scofield was first elected to the State Legislature in 2010, becoming majority leader of the state Senate in 2020.

Governor Kay Ivey will announce a special election in the next few weeks to fill Scofield's now-vacant seat. State Representative Wes Kitchens is the first to announce his candidacy.

The deadline for qualifying for Alabama's newly drawn U.S. Congressional districts is coming soon, and the number and variety of candidates will be very interesting.

District 2 was created by a Special Master assigned by a federal court after the U.S. Supreme Court declared Alabama's gerrymandered congressional districts racist and ordered them redrawn to provide the state's Black voters with a second district with an "opportunity" to elect the candidate of their choice.

U.S. Representative Barry Moore is the incumbent for Alabama's 2nd congressional district, but his hometown of Enterprise was redrawn and added into the 1st district following the court-ordered redistricting of Alabama's congressional map. Moore has announced that he will square off against U.S. Representative Jerry Carl in a Republican battle for the newly redrawn and highly conservative 1st congressional district seat in South Alabama.

October 2023 Insights

Government Shutdown Averted

Congress narrowly avoided a government shutdown by passing a continuing resolution that extends current government spending for another 45 days. This resolution, which maintains federal agency spending at FY23 levels, was signed into law after passing both houses with bi-partisan support.

However, the vote on this agreement has resulted in some right-wing Republicans announcing they will seek to oust Speaker Kevin McCarthy. Congress now has until Nov. 17 to reach a budget deal or pass another continuing resolution.

Spending Caps

Advancement of the Appropriations bills continues to be held up by internal struggles over spending in the House Republican Caucus with a number of members seeking to enact stringent spending cuts.

As of this writing, three Appropriations bills have passed the House, while six of the remaining eight Appropriations bills have cleared the Appropriations Committee. In the Senate, all 12 Appropriations have been approved by the Appropriations Committee, but none have cleared the Senate.

In September, the House Budget Committee approved a proposal to balance the Federal budget in ten years which includes significant spending cuts. The measure is unlikely to pass the Democratcontrolled Senate.

FY24 Appropriations Bills

As we have previously reported, the allocations for the State Revolving Funds (SRF) differ significantly in the House and Senate version of the Appropriations bills.

The House bill provides a general fund base allotment of \$535 million in Clean Water SRF funding, plus \$470 million for earmarks. The Senate version provides a general fund base allotment of \$1.29 billion, plus \$345 million for earmarks. For Safe Drinking Water SRFs, the House Interior Appropriations bill provides a general fund base allotment of \$460 million, plus \$410 million for earmarks. The Senate bill provides as a general fund base allotment, \$882 million and \$244 million for earmarks.

The additional \$2.62 billion for the Clean Water SRFs and \$3 billion for Safe Drinking Water SRFs appropriated in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) is not changed.

Both Appropriations bills would provide \$20 million over five years for Water Instruction Improvement for the Nation (WIIN) grants

CWCC Advocacy

The Coalition continues to try to influence the process to head off funding cuts for SRFs. Coalition members were encouraged to urge their House and Senate Members to oppose these cuts and support SRF funding at the expected FY24 level.

The Coalition also wrote to the leadership of both Appropriations Committees expressing its opposition to SRF funding reductions and continues to express concern about earmark funding being used as takedown from the SRF base allotments. In addition, we are closely monitoring ongoing negotiations on the Appropriations process.

STREAM Act, S. 2162

Due to the unfortunate passing of Senator Dianne Feinstein, efforts to advance her bill, known as the STREAM Act, are currently unsettled. As we have noted in previous reports, the Coalition has supported this measure which would provide over a billion dollars for water recycling, surface and groundwater projects, desalination projects, drinking water projects for disadvantaged communities, and environmental restoration projects.

Additional Issues/Bills of Interest

We continue to monitor several other bills and issues, including Alternative Water Source Program and Mega Recycled Water Project funding and we are prepared to support efforts to provide additional infrastructure funding.



Health & Safety:

Watch out for Children this Halloween

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports that Halloween is consistently one of the top three days for pedestrian injuries and fatalities, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that children are four times more likely to be struck by a motor vehicle on Halloween than any other day of the year.

Tips for helping keep young ones and yourself safe this Halloween:

 Slow down in residential neighborhoods and obey all traffic signs and signals. Drive at least 5 mph below

the posted speed limit to give yourself extra time to react to children who may dart into the street.



- Many young children start trick-or-treating in the late afternoon/early evening, so be alert all day long. Watch for children walking on roadways, medians, and curbs.
- Look for children crossing the street. They may not be paying attention to traffic and cross the street mid-block or between parked cars.
- Turn on your headlights to make yourself more visible even in the day light and especially at sunset.
- Broaden your scanning by looking for children left and right into yards and front porches.
